The observance began over 25 years ago by the Bishops to be a moment for Catholics to take stock of the wide diversity of the Church and the ministries serving them. We apologize that the "lift" that provides handicap access to the Hall is seriously damaged and beyond repair. The problem we have is that it cannot handle the weight of the newer electric wheelchairs. Until this most recent permanent breakdown, our maintenance staff — especially Mike Burger and Jack Hale — have worked hard fixing it regularly. A new lift that would handle 750 pounds would cost \$15,000, which is not in our budget.

It is very difficult to get that amount donated. In March, when we will be sure of the decision of the Bishop about clustering, we can work on this effort. In the meantime, we are looking at all of our options.
