On Ash Wednesday: Masses will be at 8:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. after which ashes will be distributed.

Ash Wednesday, and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. Fasting means the limiting of oneself to a full meal per day. All Catholics who have reached their 18th birthday and have not reached their 60th Birthday are obligated to fast. Abstinence from meat begins for all Catholics who have reached their 14th Birthday. There is no age when abstinence stops. All Catholics, age 14 and older, are required to practice abstinence from meat on Ash Wednesday and all of the Fridays of Lent as long as their health permits.

The U.S. Census Bureau is recruiting temporary part-time census takers for the 2010 Census. The pay is good, the part-time hours are flexible, and the work is close to home. Thousands of census takers are needed to update address lists and conduct interviews with community residents. Most positions require a valid driver's license and use of a vehicle with mileage reimbursement. However, public transportation may be authorized in certain areas. Bilingual speakers are encouraged to apply! All census takers must be able to speak English, but bilingual skills in English and other languages are needed in communities that have a large number of residents who speak a language other than English. The CEITC has organized expert volunteer tax-preparers at 38 sites around Cleveland where you can get **FREE tax preparation**.
