Did you know?

St. Colman's has been working for the past year or so to be more responsible in our use of resources and in our purchasing practices. For example, for about a year all of the coffee we use in the Parish Office and for all parish events is fairly-traded coffee. This means that the people growing, harvesting and selling the coffee get much more of the profit than if they had to grow their crops for big food conglomerates. While the coffee costs a little bit more, we know that it is worth it because our coffee purchases directly benefit those who work so hard to produce it for our enjoyment.
